Life satisfaction: Graduate 93%. Non-graduate 83%

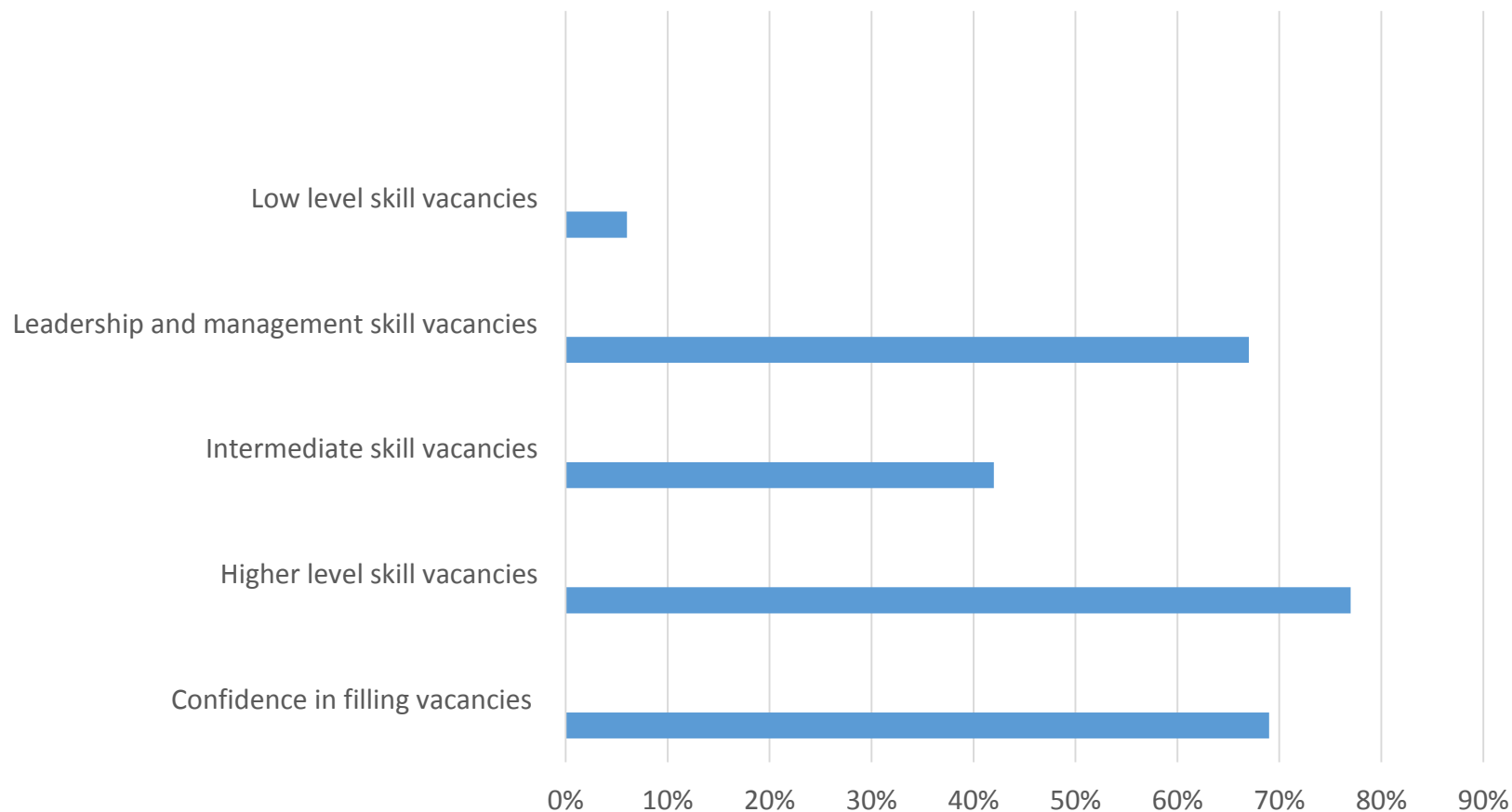
Health referrals: Aged 25 -35 non-grad. 20% compared to grad. 8%.
